The experts, armed with a pencil and a camera would take you through the whole thing in space of a couple of pages. The time involved and cost of the all the parts often didn't reflect reality. They would have a list of the parts needed and machining prices they were able to get. The parts needed for assembly after the upgrades were incomplete or quoted at a dealer cost and everybody had a friend that was a machinist who worked for little or nothing.
